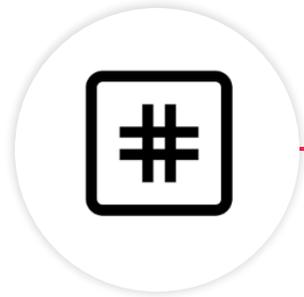

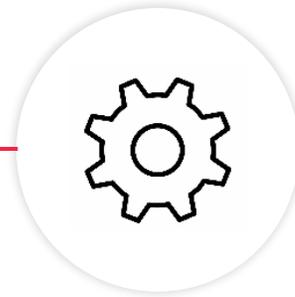

# Spreadsheets only work in smaller settings.

- **Users must manually enter all steps** taken and there is no backup audit log.
- **They don't send out reminders**, so important task dates & deadlines can be missed.
- **Lack of follow-up** can lead to liability, potential litigation, or appeals.



# Email should never be used to store or track records.



- **Used to be considered conversational**, but more people are using it incorrectly for records storage.
- **Only specific individuals have access** to email; difficult to search for records and to locate for eDiscovery.
- **Company retention and employee turnover** leaves records storage in email vulnerable for deletion or mismanagement.

# Software assists an entity in overall tracking and fulfillment of records requests.

- **Monitors deadlines** and time commitments, including workflow reminders.
- **Can issue invoices and receive payments** and provide overall dashboard data and ROI analytics surrounding your FOIA process.
- **Enables use of AI** for similar responses or response categorization or routing.
- **The public can be notified** their information is available and access the information without involving staff.



# Why a FOIA software solution and not a Records Management System (RMS)?

**An RMS stores a document for its entire lifecycle;** why retain information and responses that are no longer legally required to be kept.



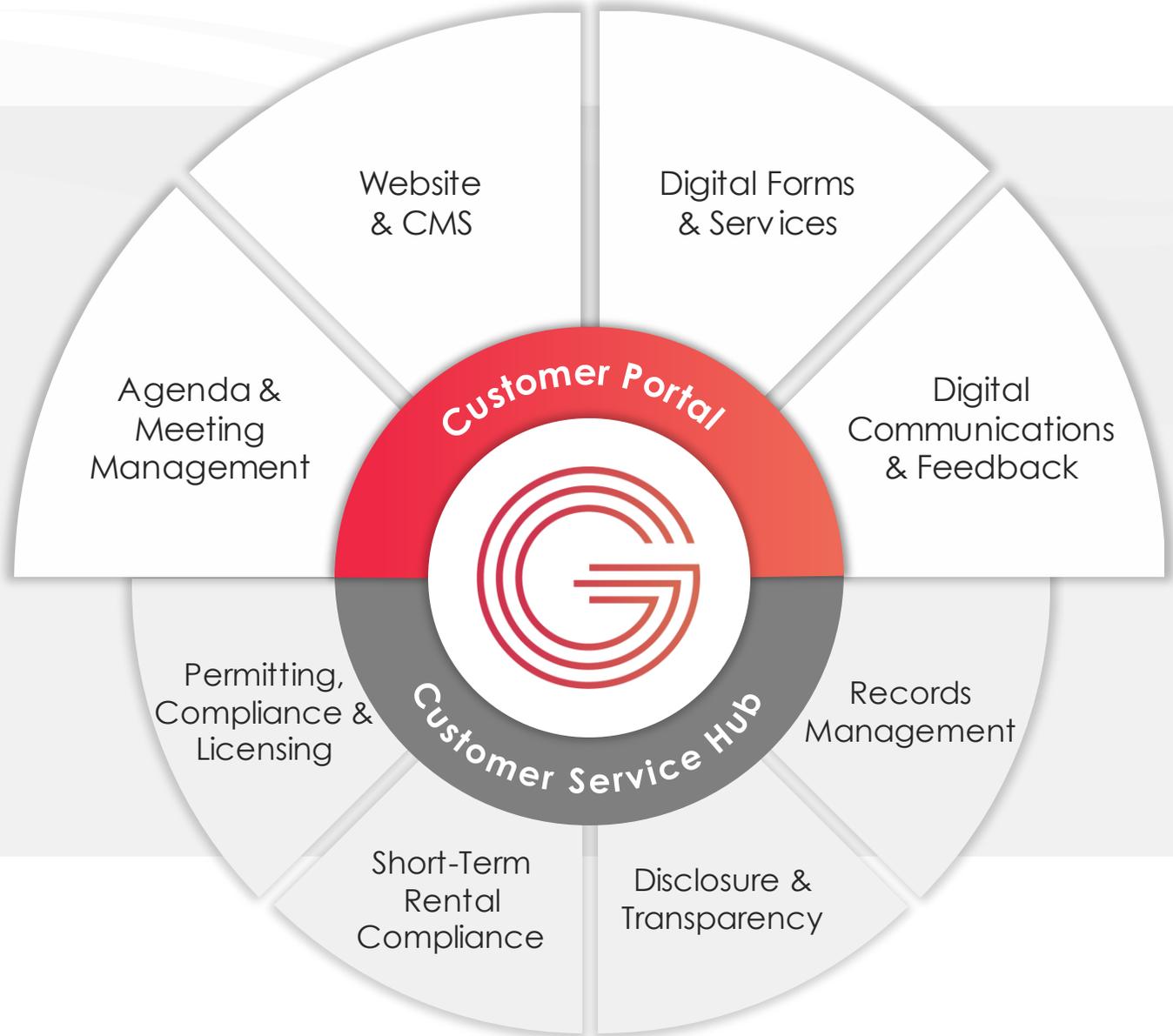
**A FOIA system would most likely have that same information** uploaded but with redactions to make the document public.

**An RMS may have protected,** private, or confidential information stored in them.



**A FOIA/CRM system would only allow access** to what is put in there for the public to access (i.e. public and transparent).
