- ✓ **Provide clear evacuation plans** | Share detailed maps and instructions for evacuation routes in flood-prone areas. Make these available online, through public signage, and at community centers.
- ✓ **Encourage flood insurance** | Educate the community on the importance of flood insurance, especially in high-risk zones. Provide resources for where and how to purchase coverage.
- ✓ **Deliver timely and accurate information** | During a flood, communicate frequently across multiple channels (SMS, social media, email, website) to ensure residents stay informed about the latest developments, including road closures and shelter locations.
- ✓ **Foster long-term community engagement** | Engage the community year-round on flood risks and preparedness, not just during flood season. Regular reminders and educational campaigns will keep flood preparedness top of mind.
